## AA SCREENING DETERMINATION

Of Derrycashel Bog, Co Roscommon Decommissioning and Rehabilitation 2021 (the “Project”)

In accordance with Article 6(3) of the EU Habitats Directive (Directive 92/43/EEC) (“Habitats Directive”) and Regulation 42(1) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended (“Habitats Regulations”), Bord na Móna has undertaken Appropriate Assessment (“AA”) screening to assess, in view of best scientific knowledge and the conservation objectives of the European Site(s), if the Project, individually or in combination with other plans or projects is likely to have a significant effect on a European Site(s).

Regulation 42(1) states “A screening for Appropriate Assessment of a plan or project for which [...] a public authority wishes to undertake [...] shall be carried out by the public authority to assess, in view of best scientific knowledge and in view of the conservation objectives of the site, if that plan or project, individually or in combination with other plans or projects is likely to have a significant effect on the European site.”

In this context, particular attention was paid to the European Site(s) listed below:

- Lough Forbes Complex SAC;
- Lough Ree SAC;
- Brown Bog SAC;
- Clooneen Bog SAC;
- Corbo Bog SAC;
- Mount Jessop Bog SAC;
- Fortwilliam Turlough SAC;
- Annaghmore Lough (Roscommon) SAC;
- Ballykenny-Fisherstown SPA; &
- Lough Ree SPA.

Regulation 42(2) “A public authority shall carry out a screening for Appropriate Assessment under paragraph (1) before consent for a plan or project is given, or a decision to undertake or adopt a plan or project is taken.” Having taken the view that the activity required for the Decommissioning and Rehabilitation of Derrycashel Bog, Co Roscommon might constitute ‘projects’<sup>1</sup> within the meaning of the Habitats Regulations, Bord na Móna decided that the activities required should be subject to screening for AA pursuant to Regulation 42 of the Habitats Regulations and Article 6(3) of the Habitats Directive.

Tom Donnellan, CEO Bord na Móna, delegated the function of making the determination of the screening for AA to Bord na Móna’s Company Secretary and General Counsel on the 5<sup>th</sup> May 2021.

<sup>1</sup> The Habitats Regulations contain a broad definition of “project” to include any “land use or infrastructural developments, including any development of land or on land”. Although the decommissioning and rehabilitation activity are exempted developments under the Planning and Development Acts 2000-2011, Bord na Móna acknowledges the activity might constitute a ‘project’ within the meaning of the Habitats Regulations.



In performing this determination of the screening for AA, I had regard to information contained in the following documents:

- 1) MKO's description of the Project and baseline environment;
- 2) MKO's Identification of relevant European Sites;
- 3) MKO's Article 6(3) Appropriate Assessment Screening Statement and Conclusions; &
- 4) Appendices to MKO's Article 6(3) Appropriate Assessment Screening Report, which include Derrycashel Bog Cutaway Bog Decommissioning and Rehabilitation Plan 2021.

In performing this determination of the screening for AA I also met with and discussed with the following members of staff from Bord na Móna, Doreen King, Project Manager and Chris Cullen, Ecologist and the following members of staff from MKO, the Planning and Environmental Consultants engaged by Bord na Móna, Inga Reich and Pat Roberts.

Having performed screening for AA in respect of the specific activities required for the Decommissioning and Rehabilitation of Derrycashel Bog, Co Roscommon, in accordance with Regulation 42(7) Habitats Directive, **I accept the recommendation of MKO that the activities proposed at Derrycashel Bog, Co Roscommon, in view of best scientific knowledge, on the basis of objective information and in light of the conservation objectives of the relevant European Sites, that the proposed works, individually or in combination with other plans and projects, will not have a significant effect on any European Site.**

Therefore, Bord na Móna hereby determines that, following screening, an AA is not required for the Project as it is not directly connected with or necessary to the management of any Site(s) as European Site(s) and as it can be concluded, on the basis of objective information, that the project, individually or in combination with other plans or projects is not likely to have a significant effect on any European Site(s) listed above.
